

Overnight South Park Bridge Closures: October 3, 4, 6, and 7

Lower Duwamish Waterway Superfund Site - Upper Reach Construction


The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the members of the Lower Duwamish Waterway Group (LDWG), which consists of The Boeing Company, the City of Seattle, and King County, are starting the second season of cleanup of the Lower Duwamish Waterway Superfund site this fall.

At times, some of the construction work near and under the South Park Bridge will require full bridge closure to vehicles and pedestrians for equipment access and safety.

Upcoming South Park Bridge Closures



Bridge will be fully closed
Friday, October 3, and Saturday,
October 4, ending the morning of
October 5. Closures will occur from
7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Next week, King County Road Services will also close the South Park Bridge to traffic on the following nights: Monday, October 6, and Tuesday, October 7, ending the morning of October 8.

If additional dates are needed, the bridge may be closed again at night on October 9, 10, and 11. We will notify the community if these additional dates are needed.

Unlike daytime construction, recreational vessels will not be permitted to pass beneath the South Park Bridge during this time.

King County Metro Route 60 will be rerouted during the hours of the bridge closures. During this time, the bridge will be in the "raised" position to accommodate dredging activities underneath the bridge.

As per bridge requirements, closures will not occur during the peak morning and afternoon commute hours (which are between 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. to 7 p.m.).

The LDWG team is coordinating closely with King County Road Services and the local community to keep everyone informed about when these closures will occur and any future construction-related closures. Closures will be announced through the Lower Duwamish Cleanup Email Newsletter, social media, flyers in the community, emails to local organizations, standard road closure signage, and by King County Road Services' My Commute platform, [KingCounty.gov/MyCommute](https://kingcounty.gov/MyCommute).
