


Lower Duwamish Waterway Season 2 Cleanup Construction Begins in October! Construction at South Park Marina this October

The construction contractor will work on two cleanup areas near the South Park Marina called Sediment Management Areas (SMAs) 13 and 14A. These are shown on the map below.

Night Work to Occur at South Park Marina on October 8

On **Wednesday, October 8**, crews will work at night to place clean sand at **SMA 13**. This material will cover the contaminated sediment, to speed up the natural recovery process. This work must take place during low tide.

- ▶ Starting as early as **7 p.m.**, trucks will enter the South Park Marina parking lot through the south entrance on Dallas Avenue South.
- ▶ Trucks will make multiple trips to deliver clean sand, place it at SMA 13, and return with additional loads. This work is expected to take all night to complete.
- ▶ Nearby residents and marina tenants may notice construction vehicles, equipment noise, lighting, and worker throughout the night.

This work is expected to take one night only. **If an additional night is needed, crews will return on Thursday, October 9, around the same time**, and the construction team will notify the marina on-site manager that morning.

What to Expect During Construction

On October 1, the construction contractor will begin dredging contaminated sediment in areas near the South Park Bridge and Duwamish River People's Park. During this second construction season, cleanup activities will be more visible as they move closer to the South Park Bridge, homes, parks, and marinas in the area.

While work is underway, you may notice:

- ▶ Multiple barges and heavy equipment on the water
- ▶ Lighting for safe work during dark hours
- ▶ Typical construction noise

Season 2 construction hours will be weekdays and Saturdays and will occur during both the daytime and nighttime. Hours will vary based on factors such as tides and the type of work being conducted (e.g., dredging sediment, placing clean material, etc.).

Plan Ahead for South Park Bridge Closures

At times, construction work will require full closure of the South Park Bridge to vehicle and pedestrian traffic for equipment access and safety.

LDWG and the construction team are coordinating closely with King County Road Services, Tribes, and other partners to keep everyone informed about when these closures will occur. The outreach team will provide advance notification to the community.

Closures will be announced through the LDWG Construction Email Newsletter (subscribe at ldwg.org/construction-news/), social media, flyers in the community, emails to local organizations, standard road closure signage, and by King County Road Services' [My Commute](https://kingcounty.gov/mycommute/) platform, gismaps.kingcounty.gov/mycommute/
