Cleanup Construction Activities

Season 2 construction in the upper reach, the southernmost two miles of the Lower Duwamish Waterway Superfund site, will continue through February 2026. Season 2 construction will occur on weekdays and Saturdays, with **work taking place during both daytime and, when needed, nighttime hours**. Work hours will vary based on factors such as tides and the type of work being conducted (e.g., dredging or placing clean material). Work will be coordinated with Tribal fishing.

Please note that in-water construction activities are dynamic and weather-dependent. All schedules are subject to change. Visit LDWG.org for the most up-to-date information.

Environmental & Community Report

With oversight from the EPA, we are working to minimize the impact of construction on those who work, live, and spend time along the Duwamish Waterway. Stay informed about environmental monitoring and construction activities by viewing our weekly report linked above.

What to Expect During the Week of November 24

Cleanup activities will occur in Sediment Management Areas (SMA) 14A, 14C, 14D, 15A, and 9 (see map linked above). Cleanup at SMA 14A, 14C, and 14D involves placing clean material in locations where our contractor completed dredging earlier in the construction season.

Cleanup activities will not occur on Thursday, November 27, through Saturday, November 29, in observance of the Thanksgiving holiday. Our regular Friday newsletter will be published on Monday, December 1.

What to Expect During the Week of December 1

Cleanup dredging activities will occur at SMA 9 and will occur during the daytime, between 6:30 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Starting December 1 and continuing through December 6, crews will be working at night to place clean material in dredged areas near the South Park Bridge, at SMA 14D. They will then move to SMA 11A, south of Duwamish River People's Park, to dredge. Nighttime work hours will be from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Nighttime work may continue into the week of December 8.

During this time, you may hear noise from construction equipment and see lights for safe work. Please reach out to the Cleanup Outreach Team if you have any concerns (1-888-561-5394).

Overnight South Park Bridge Closures December 1 and 2

The South Park Bridge will be fully closed to all vehicles and pedestrians on the nights of Monday, December 1, and Tuesday, December 2, from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m., while crews place clean material under the bridge. It will reopen at 6 a.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday, with closures ending the morning of Wednesday, December 3.

During this time, the bridge will be in a raised position. This allows crews to place clean material under the bridge in locations where they dredged earlier in the construction season. Unlike daytime construction, recreational vessels will not be permitted to pass beneath the South Park Bridge during this nighttime work.

King County Metro 60, which travels over the South Park Bridge, will be rerouted during the hours of the bridge closures. King County Metro will provide Route 60
